Thank you so much for your support of the ministry of Cattle for Christ International Inc., (CCI). It is amazing how God is honoring your faithfulness as a donor, and our obedience as a ministry to His vision for effectively and efficiently reaching the un-reached around the world.

I hope this detailed accounting of every dollar received by this ministry in 2003 will help you to see the significant impact you have made in the Kingdom of God and in the lives of people around the world. Without your help, none of this would have been possible.

There is no way to tell all the stories or to list all the ministries enabled by CCI since we were incorporated in Jun 2001. However, this report will make evident that we are doing what we said we would do with your donations by using them faithfully to minister to the world with the highest level of integrity and accountability. This same report for 2001/2002 is on our web site for your review. If you do not have Internet access please call and I will mail it to you.

The only donated money spent to date on CCI ministry expenses in 2001-2003 was \$209.05 (\$118.05 which was spent to open our checking account and order checks and \$91.00 bank charges for a bad donor check). Praise the Lord!!

There is still so much need and so many people who have not had a chance to hear the Gospel or experience the love of Christ in a personal way. Together we can make a real difference in their lives. Please pray and ask God what He would have you do this year to help us take Jesus to those who otherwise will not hear. I do not think you will find a better investment or ministry. Perhaps God is leading you to provide regular monthly support of this ministry.

2003 Total Receipts: \$ 206,526.62

2003 Disbursements:

1. \$ 2,650.00 (1st Installment – Mar 2003) to fund the training, equipping and sending of indigenous leaders to villages, cities, and countries where the culture and language are similar to their own and where there are no missionaries, and in most cases, no Christian churches or pastors. This greatly accelerates and enhances the evangelism and Church planting efforts in these areas at a fraction of the costs associated with sending Western missionaries, and they are immediately effective. Indigenous Christian leaders/church planters were funded throughout Asia and other predominately Muslim countries. The nations that these national leaders are from include, but are not limited to, Nigeria, India, Philippines, Mexico, Egypt, Syria, and Honduras. For safety reasons, we cannot publish the countries where they serve.
2. \$ 1,000.00 to provide resources and training for church planting and evangelism efforts in Chachapoya, Peru.
3. \$ 2,000.00 (1st Installment – Mar 2003) to fund a feeding program for children ravaged by Hurricane Mitch. More than 250 children are being fed weekly and are being evangelized and discipled.
4. \$10,363.10 to help construct modest church buildings and to provide evangelism resources and materials for forty three new churches planted in Mexico, where there has previously not been a Christian church. These congregations are made up of newly converted Christians who were themselves evangelized, have been worshipping together, but have not had a church building or any resources for reaching out to the people around them. The buildings are modest in their structure, but meet the need and they are not built until the congregation is established.
5. \$ 5,000.00 (1st Installment – Sep 2003) to fund Christian radio broadcasts from outside India, into India. We helped to fund 9 hours of broadcasting each day, in 15 minute segments. These messages are in many of the native languages in India and are presented to evangelize and disciple the un-reached in India and surrounding countries. Since 49% of the population is illiterate, and since Christian churches/missionaries are so few and far between, this is often the only way to reach these remote people with the Gospel.
6. \$ 3,000.00 to fund a Child Evangelism Conference in Monterrey, MX where 85 children's workers were trained and given resources for evangelism, discipleship, and training of the children in their own churches, as well as, in the communities/villages around them.
7. \$ 600.00 to provide resources for and to conduct evangelism outreach ministries in Nicaragua.

8. \$ 900.00 to help conduct a Pastor's training event in La Paz, Bolivia for 55 pastors. These pastors received much needed training in Bible, evangelism, discipleship, church planting, etc., and they were given resources to take with them that otherwise would be un-available.
9. \$ 3,000.00 to help build a medical clinic in an area of Chinchá, Peru where the poorest of residents had no access to medical care/treatment.
10. \$ 9,000.00 to conduct a Pastor's training event in India for approximately 250 pastors and leaders. These pastors received much needed training in Bible, evangelism, discipleship, church planting, etc., and they were given resources to take with them that otherwise would be un-available.
11. \$ 5,000.00 (2nd Installment – May 2003) to fund the training, equipping and sending of indigenous leaders to villages, cities, and countries where the culture and language are similar to their own and where there are no missionaries, and in most cases, no Christian churches or pastors. This greatly accelerates and enhances the evangelism and Church planting efforts in these areas at a fraction of the costs associated with send Western missionaries, and they are immediately effective. Indigenous Christian leaders/church planters were funded throughout Asia and other predominately Muslim countries. The nations that these national leaders are from include, but are not limited to, Nigeria, India, Philippines, Mexico, Egypt, Syria, and Honduras. 12. \$ 1,500.00 to conduct children's workers training event in Honduras in 2004. Participants will receive training and resources to help them reach the children in their own communities/villages.
13. \$ 2,000.00 to help purchase a video projector in Peru for showing the Jesus Film in remote un-reached locations and in Bible Schools for Lay Pastors.
14. \$ 1,500.00 to provide training for children's worker/coordinators in Juan Jui, Peru. Without this training, these workers would have no help or training to prepare them for this ministry.
15. \$ 2,000.00 to construct a modest church building for a new church plant in Brazil. Some of this money was also used to provide evangelism resources for this congregation so that they could reach out to others in their community and surrounding towns/villages.
16. \$ 2,000.00 to fund a Backyard Bible Club in San Cristobal, Venezuela. Evangelism resources for 65 children were provided and resulted in the starting of a new church.
17. \$ 4,500.00 (1st Installment – Mar 2003) to publish/print Christian literature, evangelism tracts, New Testaments, and discipleship resources in China and Tibet.

Without the printing of this literature, the people in these countries would have very little or no access to such resources. This is much cheaper than buying such literature and sending to China and Tibet. For example, we fund the printing of the Gospel of John, in the native language, for only six cents per copy.

18. \$10,000.00 to help provide support for 112 native missionary families in India for three months. On average, this same amount of money would have provided only 1 ½ months support for one Western missionary family. These native missionaries already know the language and the culture of their people so they are immediately effective. They also are more readily trusted and are accustomed to the meager lifestyle and daily rations.
19. \$ 4,000.00 to fund the printing of evangelistic tracts and literature and to fund church planting efforts in the un-churched areas of Mexico.
20. \$ 2,000.00 to purchased materials to put tin roofs on mud churches in remote areas of Bolivia. These materials, though much cheaper than we buy them far here, are still much too expensive for the poor people in these areas.
21. \$ 1,500.00 to purchase desks, tables, and basic educational materials necessary to train/educate 400 refugee children in the Middle East (Name of country no listed for safety reasons). These Muslim children would have no education opportunity at all if not for this Christian school. This school was constructed in 2002, and was the vision of some Muslim men who had been converted to Christianity and were seeking to impact children and their families for the Gospel.
22. \$12,000.00 to provide support and resources for one year for an Ethiopian pastor and his family of five adopted Somali orphans. This will allow him to have the time and resources to become self supporting through a bus ministry that he will use to provide his own support, and to start up a chicken farm that he will use to generate income and food for his village. This pastor and the native Christians that help him, have a ministry to several hundred children who have been orphaned due to the long civil war in that country. They have opened up many group homes where children are taken in and raised in the ways of the Lord while being taught a trade.
23. \$ 500.00 to purchase supplies for child evangelism/discipleship services in San Cristobal, Venezuela. This purchased supplies for over 70 children.
24. \$ 3000.00 to help fund an International Children's Workers training event in Wilmore, KY on 2-11 August 2004. Key children's ministry coordinators from Mexico, Peru, Venezuela, and America will attend this event to equip them to better train their own people. They will also be provided with resources in their native language.
25. \$ 1,800.00 to build a new church near Sapasoa, Peru.

26. \$ 2,000.00 to print 1,000 New Testaments in Arabic that were distributed in Iraq. This was the first access these Muslims had to the written Word and to the Gospel message in their own language.
27. \$ 1,252.00 to help purchase a new roof for a church in Juan Jui, Peru.
28. \$ 1,000.00 to send a Venezuelan evangelist to Mexico to conduct a pastor's training conference. Much benefit is gained from this cross-cultural training, especially when the language is basically the same.
29. \$ 5,000.00 (1st Installment – Sep 2003) to fund the printing of Christian tracts, Bibles and New Testaments in India and surrounding countries. These are printed in many native languages and are printed in country at a fraction of the cost associated with buying them and then sending them in. For example, the New Testaments are printed for 25 cents per copy. The vast majority of the recipients of these Bibles have never owned, held or even seen God's Word. Most have never once heard the name of Jesus.
30. \$ 1,000.00 for church construction in Guadalupe, Honduras. A medical team, sewing classes, and Vacation Bible School was also part of this event.
31. \$ 1, 227.00 to help expand a Christian school in Chinchá, Peru. Cattle for Christ has significantly impacted this project in 2001, 2002 and 2003. This school now incorporates grades 1-12 and has resulted in the salvation and discipleship of hundreds of children and parents alike. This school provides a first rate education, introduces and nurtures their Christian faith, and has resulted in countless families being evangelized and discipled.
32. \$ 3,886.00 to conduct survey work in potential new areas of ministry. This trip will not be conducted until 2004, but is scheduled for Bangladesh. These trips are necessary to identify need, to build relationship/trust, and to verify all the requirements/facts needed for support/work to begin. Survey trips help to make sure that the need is legitimate and that resources are used effectively, efficiently and honorably.
33. \$ 5,943.00 to help fund the ministries and travel of the World Missionary Administrator of supported ministries in South America, India and Africa.
34. \$ 6,750.00 to fund the training of college age students from the House Church Movement in China. These students are trained in Bible, computers, music, English, and cross-cultural evangelism to Tibetans and Muslims. This training enables them to not only reach people outside their local areas and culture, but also to become self supporting as they use these skills to conduct ministry.
35. \$ 2,500.00 to conduct two Christian education seminars in Peru where 140 workers were trained so that they could return to their own churches and communities and

- better disciple their own people. Trainees were also provided resource materials to take with them.
36. \$11,389.00 to support several Agape Homes for children in the poorest areas of India. Over 27 group homes are now helping to train, evangelize, disciple, love and care for over 1,000 homeless children in India.
 37. \$ 3,130.00 to provide resources for an evangelism retreat in Brazil. Training in the English language was used as a platform for evangelism. Many people accepted Christ as their Savior and many more renewed their commitments to Him as Lord of their lives.
 38. \$ 4,000.00 (1st Installment – Mar 2003) to fund feeding programs in Lima, Peru for over 500 street children per month. These feeding stations are set up in five locations. The children are fed and participate in Vacation Bible School type sessions on these days. This ministry has also opened up significant opportunities to evangelize the single mothers of the children who have them. Cattle for Christ helped to purchase a commercial sewing machine to help these mothers support themselves and as a source of evangelism. Many forgotten children have found the love and salvation of Christ through these feeding programs.
 39. \$ 5,000.00 to fund church leader training workshop in India for four days. More than 2,000 pastors/Christian workers received this training.
 40. \$ 5,400.00 (2nd Installment – May 2003) to publish/print Christian literature, evangelism tracts, New Testaments, and discipleship resources in China and Tibet. Without the printing of this literature, the people in these countries would have very little or no access to such resources. This is much cheaper than buying such literature and sending to China and Tibet. For example, we fund the printing of the Gospel of John, in the native language, for only six cents per copy.
 41. \$ 4,000.00 (2nd Installment – Dec 2003) to fund Christian radio broadcasts from outside India, into India. We helped to fund 9 hours of broadcasting each day, in 15 minute segments. These messages are in many of the native languages in India and are presented to evangelize and disciple the un-reached in India and surrounding countries. Since 49% of the population is illiterate, and since Christian churches/missionaries are so few and far between, this is often the only way to reach these remote people with the Gospel.
 42. \$ 1,000.00 to provide construction materials for a new church in Chachapoya, Peru.
 43. \$ 1,850.00 to help fund the ministries and travel of the World Missionary Administrator of supported ministries in China and Tibet.
 44. \$ 4,000.00 (2nd Installment – Dec 2003) to fund the printing of Christian tracts, Bibles and New Testaments in India and surrounding countries. These are printed in many

- native languages and are printed in country at a fraction of the cost associated with buying them and then sending them in. For example, the New Testaments are printed for 25 cents per copy. The vast majority of the recipients of these Bibles have never owned, held or even seen God's Word. Most have never once heard Jesus' name.
45. \$ 1,200.00 to provide total support for one native missionary family in India for one year. This provided the support needed for his family as well as the resources he needed to evangelize and plant churches among the un-reached villages.
 46. \$ 3,363.00 (2nd Installment – May 2003) to fund a feeding program for children ravaged by Hurricane Mitch. More than 250 children are being fed weekly and are being evangelized and discipled.
 47. \$ 1,000.00 to provide new Bibles for pastors in Peru. This was part of a pastor's training event. Some of the pastor's Bibles were worn out or missing pages due to lack of adequate shelter, transportation, etc..
 48. \$ 8,590.00 to fund a Pastor's training event for 60 pastors/Christian leaders in Trujillo, Peru. Pastors received training in Bible, evangelism, discipleship, church planting, etc.. Also each trainee was given the Thompson's Chain Link Reference Bible, which is one of the best study Bibles in print. There is no way, these pastors could have ever had access to this type of resource on their own.
 49. \$ 2,018.35 to help fund the ministries and travel of the World Missionary Administrator of supported ministries in South America, India and Africa.
 50. \$ 1,165.20 (2nd Installment – May 2003) to fund feeding programs in Lima, Peru for over 500 street children per month. These feeding stations are set up in five locations. The children are fed and participate in Vacation Bible School type sessions on these days. This ministry has also opened up significant opportunities to evangelize the single mothers of the children who have them. Cattle for Christ helped to purchase a commercial sewing machine to help these mothers support themselves and as a source of evangelism. Many forgotten children have found the love and salvation of Christ through these feeding programs.
 51. \$ 2,000.00 to help fund a children's workers training event for 80 children's workers in Nicaragua. Four workers from twenty churches will attend this event in Jul 04. They will also receive valuable resources to take back with them.
 52. \$ 91.00 Administrative Expenses. Bank charges to cover a donor check for insufficient funds.
